In order to be successful in academics, ISTEP remedial classes, spell bowl, super bowl, tutoring led by seniors, contact sessions for extra help, Project XL competition, and Spanish and Latin are offered for Elwood students. Because of this preparation ISTEP scores have increased dramatically: English scores increased from $53 \%$ to $66 \%$, the math scores increased from $50 \%$ to $61 \%$, and the percentage of students passing both tests increased from $47 \%$ to $58 \%$.
